

# CONFIRMATION PLAN



## The Journey: Confirmation at St. Luke's *BELONG, BECOME, BELIEVE*

Confirmation is not a destination; rather, it is the beginning of a lifelong journey and a great adventure. The Journey is a confirmation experience for students from St. Luke's and The Story. For short periods each year, middle school students will focus on a different part of their confirmation journey. Ultimately they become young men and women ready to inspire the church to live out their faith together.



## **FAQ:**

### **When will confirmation be?**

**6th grade:** 12 Sunday mornings in the Fall

Parent/Family lunches once a month in the Fall

**7th grade:** Family field trips, including church visits and group service activities

**8th grade:** 12 Sunday mornings in the Spring

Parent/Family lunches once a month in Spring

### **What is our hope for confirmation?**

- 1) Students will be able to make an informed, conscious choice to trust in Jesus.
- 2) Students will experience their faith as a lifelong journey, not a one-time event.
- 3) Students will develop deep and lasting relationships with other students and adults and feel a deep sense of belonging within this church community.
- 4) Students will learn their own gifting and be empowered as leaders within this community to inspire their brothers and sisters in Christ with their lived faith.

### **Why does St. Luke's do confirmation over three years?**

Once upon a time confirmation was a year-long program in the sixth grade. Our shift to spreading it over three years was result of years of feedback from both parents and leaders. Middle school represents a pivotal time in the life of young people. The Journey is designed to create an experience that is always age appropriate and always meaningful.

Since shifting to this format we have seen participation by confirmands in other aspects of student ministry, such as our small groups, increase considerably.



Furthermore, since making this switch we have noticed that many more high school students continue to stay engaged in the life of the church.

### **Families are so busy already. Will this take up more time?**

This format is designed to be **more** manageable for busy families than an intensive one year program. The confirmation activities that we have always done in one very busy year are now spread among three years.

### **What about the trips?**

Retreats will continue to be an important component of connecting students in the life of the ministry. We recommend students continue to participate in as many trips as possible. However, we have designated a ‘focus’ trip for each year that aligns with the theme of that year.

### **When does my student become a member of St. Luke's?**

At the end of their 8th grade year.

### **What about Cross Dedication?**

There will be a special cross dedication service at the end of the 6th grade fall semester. This will be an important ‘rite of passage’ as the 6th graders complete the first part of their confirmation journey.

### **What will happen with my student in between formal confirmation programs?**

Student Ministries programming will continue throughout middle school. We encourage students to join one of our Small Group Bible studies, experience our retreats, and bring a friend to one of our monthly Sunday Night Live fun events. On Sunday Mornings when students are not in confirmation they will meet in the Student Ministries building.
