Not long ago, one of our members stopped me in the parking lot and told me a story. She attended a women's event here at St. Luke's, and as part of the program, they made small manger scenes out of various household items. She enjoyed the time and the fellowship of the event but wondered what kind of impact it could really have. Not too many days later, she went to visit her daughter and grandchildren, none of whom are active in a church. She stuffed the small manger scene in her purse. As she sat down to tell them about the Christmas story, she pulled that same manger scene out of her purse and used it to tell her grandchildren the story of the birth of Jesus, the incarnation. She said, "the time we shared together was truly holy." I said, "that is a God thing for sure." She went on to say, "God does more things through this church than you can possibly imagine!"

One way is numbers: number of people who attend worship, number of baptisms and professions of faith, number of people in small groups, number of service hours, number of first-time visitors, number of children and students. Numbers do matter.

Scripture tells us that 3,000 people became believers at Pentecost, and Jesus fed 5,000 with the loaves and the fishes. The Bible wouldn't include such numbers if they didn't matter at all. This document will outline some of the figures that can help reveal what God is doing in our midst.

But numbers aren't the only way. How does one measure hearts that are changed, marriages that are strengthened, people who help their neighbors, passion for the kingdom of God? How does one document the comfort provided by a community of faith surrounding someone who has lost a loved one? How does one measure increased kindness, improved patience, enlarged compassion, happier children, and more joyful daily living? How does one know if we have intensified gratitude or greater rejoicing in the Lord? And how does one know how those changed hearts have transformed workplaces, neighborhoods, family dinner tables?

St. Luke's mission is to equip families and individuals to live and love like Jesus, and our vision is that the transformed living would transform our city with the love of Jesus. Our job is to change hearts. Those changed hearts reach out and change the lives of people around us. We hope to share some snapshots and stories of those changed lives in this publication today.
